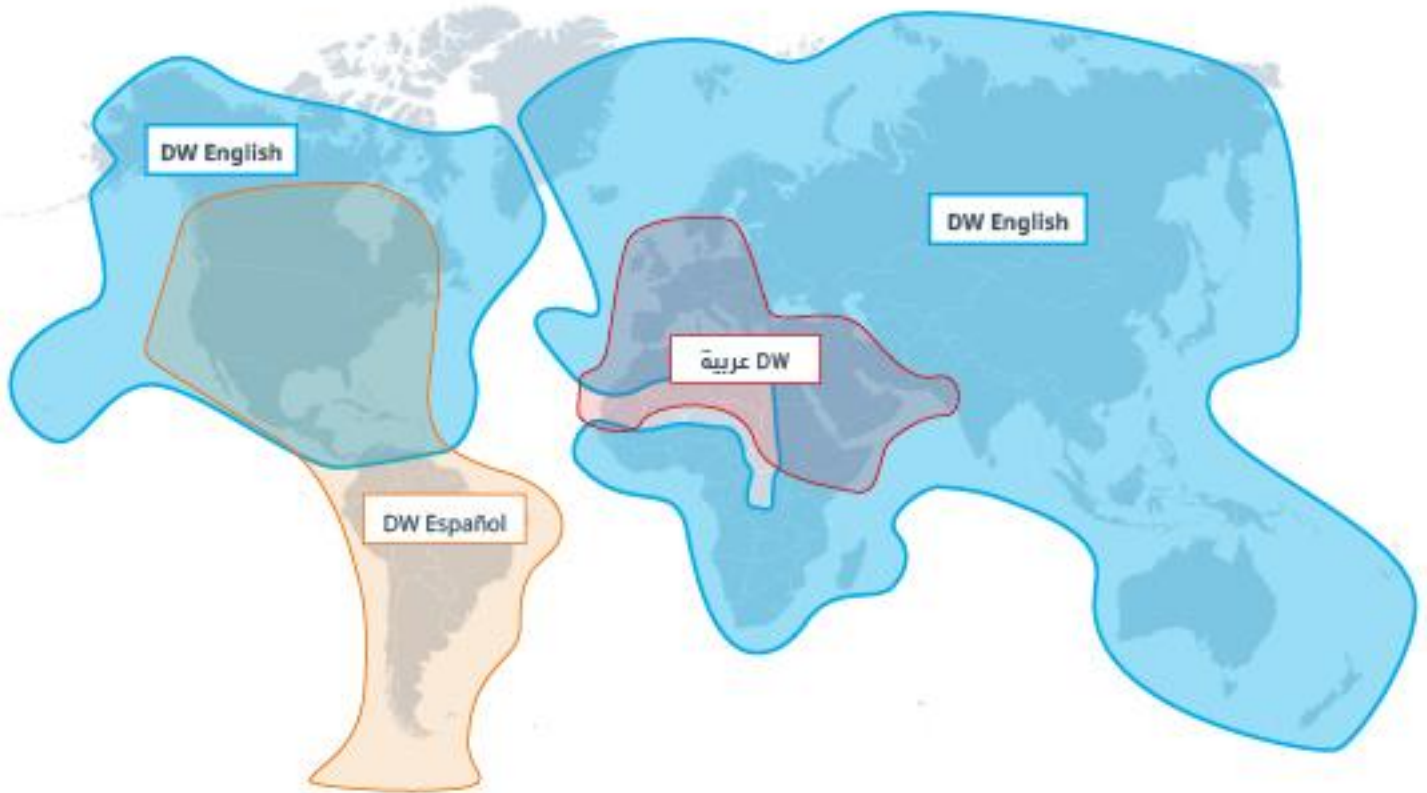

Varanasi - India's Holy City of Death**

In India, Varanasi is considered a holy city. Millions of Hindus believe that people who die here, in this city on the Ganges, are lucky. Because if they are cremated here, they can break the eternal cycle of birth, death and rebirth. Director Oliver Mayer grew up in a world in which most people are influenced by the Christian promise of eternal life. In Varanasi, he wants to understand why it is considered salvation to escape a cycle of rebirth.

He himself has already had to come to terms with death: A few years ago, his mother died, and it took him a long time to come to terms with his grief. He is fascinated by the fact that the end of life is not necessarily seen as negative in Hinduism. He wants to know how people manage to face death pragmatically and without fear - indeed, almost looking forward to it.

Mayer visits a very special hospice for the dying in Varanasi. Here, he encounters a different, more relaxed approach to death. He meets extraordinary people. They include the priests and relatives who care for the dying, workers from lower castes who cremate the dead and children like nine-year-old Kajal, who poses for photos dressed as the deity Shiva to earn money to support herself, her mother and her little brother.

US 2024 - Heartbeat of a Divided Nation

The US in 2024: a fateful year, for a divided nation. This film tracks the heartbeat of US society over several months during the presidential election campaign. Observing the everyday lives of very different people, it asks: how does America tick?

The divide between rich and poor become ever more acute in recent years. So has the gap between rural areas and urban centers. Amid heightened tensions, violence is increasingly replacing the culture of debate. For some, the possible re-election of Donald Trump is the worst catastrophe imaginable. For others, it is the solution to all problems. Fear prevails in a country where many people are threatened with social collapse - something Trump is capitalizing on in his election campaign. His number one issue is illegal migration.

The film follows a Black Trump supporter in Nevada who's running for the Senate; a Mexican cleaning lady who works in the mansions of the rich; an evangelical pastor out to dissuade people from voting for Trump; a first-time voter looking for political orientation; an activist from Portland who is worried about the future; and a sheriff in Arizona who's been on duty at the Mexican border for 12 years. The film gives very personal insights into their lives, hopes, dreams and fears. And it explores what's motivating Americans, in the election year of 2024.

Roosters bring little profit on the poultry market. They lay no eggs and produce little meat. So, many German hatcheries sell millions of chicks abroad. Animal welfare usually falls by the wayside.

Because they don't lay eggs, around 45 million male chicks used to be killed in Germany every year. This practice has been banned since 2022. Since then, many German egg cartons began carrying the label: "No chick killing." But, if they aren't being killed, where are the roosters now?

Rearing the animals is so expensive in Germany that most hatcheries simply cannot afford to keep the male chicks. The so-called 'brother roosters' are often sent abroad to be reared, often to Poland. But what are conditions like there? Animal welfare activists have evidence of serious abuses.

The fattened cockerels are then often sold to Africa. In Ghana, meat from Europe is usually cheaper than domestic poultry. But local Ghanaian breeders suffer massively from these cheap imports from Europe.

The film follows the trail from the hatching of the chicks in a German hatchery to rearing in Poland and sale to Ghana. The research shows: The ban on chick killing in Germany shifts the problems abroad and animal welfare is usually ignored. The law seems well-intentioned but poorly thought out.

"Everyone who survived has a story that you simply can't believe." Charlotte Knobloch survived the Holocaust - because farmer's wife Kreszentia Hummel passed her off as her own, illegitimate child and kept her hidden on her farm. Charlotte Neuland was born on 29 October 1932. She was born into a dark time: Just three months after her birth, Adolf Hitler came to power. Once the National Socialists were in charge, years of terror ensued. Boycotts against Jewish businesses and professional bans on Jews, including Charlotte's father, the established Munich lawyer Siegfried "Fritz" Neuland, were just the beginning. As time went on, life for Jewish people became increasingly threatened. The Nuremberg Laws of 1935 denounced and banned relationships between Jews and non-Jews. Charlotte's mother, Margarethe Neuland, left the family. She had converted to Judaism but could not withstand the pressure from the Gestapo. Charlotte's grandmother, Albertine Neuland, now became the girl's most important caregiver. On the night of 9-10 November 1938, six-year-old Charlotte witnessed the November pogroms: Jewish stores were destroyed and looted in front of her eyes, people were beaten, abused and taken away.

When the first deportations from Munich to the concentration camps began in 1941, Siegfried "Fritz" Neuland took his daughter to the deeply religious Catholic farmer's wife Kreszentia Hummel in Middle Franconia. With her help, Charlotte Neuland survived the National Socialist dictatorship.

Now Charlotte Knobloch, she's President of the Jewish Community of Munich and Upper Bavaria and former President of the Central Council of Jews in Germany. In this film, she tells viewers about her own life - and a past that is full of fear and loss. Despite all her devastating experiences, she would go on to become one of the most important figures representing Jewish life in the German-speaking world. She has dedicated her life to the fight for peace, equality and democracy.

Chile is going through a social and environmental crisis that is fracturing society. The wealthy nation is undergoing a migratory crisis on an unprecedented scale. Shantytowns are multiplying as a result, creating unprecedented societal tension.

Chile possesses huge mineral wealth and is an export giant. The country produces the most copper in the world, and is home to one of the globe's largest open-pit mines, the Chuquicamata mine. Located in the Atacama Desert, this mine is one kilometer deep, four kilometers long and three kilometers wide. The town of Chuquicamata had to be abandoned in 2004: as the mine grew, so did levels of waste gas and dust in the air. The extraction of raw materials has many downsides.

Chile also mines lithium and manganese and holds some of the most productive salmon farms and marine resources in the world.

At the head of this economy are major industrial groups. Most are owned by old Chilean families. Some made their fortunes in the 70s, thanks to close ties with General Pinochet's regime. The film presents the Pérez Cruz family business, which has a monopoly on gas distribution. They are typical of a small Chilean elite that is intent on defending traditional values.

But the impact of climate change and pollution represents a threat. The mining and textile industries are putting pressure on the ecosystem in a nation that grapples with extreme weather. In some regions, it no longer rains.

Heatwaves. They are occurring more and more frequently, lasting longer and becoming more intense. In Europe, temperature records are constantly being broken. One question has scientists particularly concerned: How hot will it get in the future?

"During a heatwave with peak temperatures of 45 degrees, we expect an increase in excess mortality of 30 to 40 percent in Seville," says physicist José María Martín-Olalla. He heads a project that aims to make the inhabitants of the Andalusian metropolis more aware of the danger posed by heat. One strategy: giving impending heatwaves names. Such measures are becoming increasingly important, as we begin to realize that we have underestimated heatwaves and their consequences for far too long. Although our bodies can fall back on a number of cooling mechanisms, we are reaching our limits faster than previously expected -- as a human physiologist from the Dutch research organization TNO explains. The thermal load is particularly high in cities. The record summer of 2003 in Paris, for example, led to apocalyptic conditions. According to climate experts, temperatures of 50 degrees Celsius cannot be ruled out for the French capital in the future.

But heatwaves also pose enormous challenges outside of cities. In Andalusia, coupled with prolonged periods of drought, they are endangering harvests. And temperatures are also rising dangerously in the Mediterranean. This film explores the diverse effects heatwaves have on our lives and presents adaptation strategies. What impact have heatwaves had on our lives so far? How will heatwaves develop in the future? And what adaptation options are available to us in the face of the new heat reality? These are urgent questions to which scientists in Europe are seeking answers.

The construction of the Wall was preceded by a veritable countdown. The supporters of the Wall defended it as an "anti-fascist protective rampart" and a bulwark against capitalism. Nearly three decades later, the Wall's supporters were taken by surprise, unable to prevent it from coming down without risking a global crisis.

Back in 1961, it was just as hard to believe that a political system would imprison its own people as it seemed impossible, 28 years later, that the Wall could fall peacefully. The fall of the Wall was also preceded by a countdown. The film recounts the milestones that, starting with the autumn of 1988, culminated in the historic fall of the Wall in November 1989.

Deserted - Europe's Deadly Migration Policy

Migrants continue to try and reach Europe via the Mediterranean. To stop them, European governments are giving billions of Euros to North African countries. Their security forces are expected to stop the migrants -- with deadly consequences.

The European Union is investing money in equipping and training North African security forces with the aim of stopping migrants to Europe before they reach the Mediterranean coast. However, this approach is causing enormous human suffering that has so far gone largely unnoticed by the European public. In this film, an international research team -- including Bayerischer Rundfunk, Lighthouse Reports from the Netherlands, Der Spiegel, Washington Post, Le Monde and El País -- documents the systematic arrest and abduction of migrants by North African security forces co-financed by the EU. The film shows how thousands of migrants are transported to remote areas and left to their fate without protection, while EU representatives continue to conclude new migration agreements with North African states.

For this joint production by Bayerischer Rundfunk, Deutsche Welle, Lighthouse Reports and Norddeutscher Rundfunk, reporters managed to film in challenging countries such as Libya, Mauritania, Morocco and Tunisia. They accompanied militias and obtained shocking footage, secretly filming the arrests and removal of migrants and conducting interviews with survivors. And they were there to witness the discovery, yet again, of dozens of people in the desert.

Their exhaustive research provides proof that while European governments have long been aware of what's happening in the North African desert, they're systematically looking the other way. At the same time, the film serves as a stark reminder that the victims of this policy are not anonymous numbers, but human beings with their own stories to tell.

190 million women around the world suffer from endometriosis, a chronic disease of the abdomen. For a long time, medicine didn't take these women's complaints seriously. But now, the taboo issue is finding a wider audience. Women are breaking their silence.

At the age of 14, Theresia Crone had to go to hospital for the first time with extreme abdominal pain. The pain kept on coming back, because she has endometriosis. Now, she's battling for greater awareness and recognition of the disease. Priscilla Herbil also didn't feel listened to. For 20 years, she took medication to endure menstruation.

It takes an average of seven years to get a diagnosis - a long time for women to be left suffering. Their periods are extremely painful, but the pain can also come at any time during the menstrual cycle, sometimes affecting the entire body. This is often accompanied by heavy menstrual bleeding, bowel problems, exhaustion, pain during sex and sometimes problems conceiving. The pain is caused by uterus-like cells that colonize areas outside the uterus, for example the ovaries, intestine or peritoneum.

Priscilla is keen to live a full life despite her endometriosis. This reportage accompanies her as she tackles her symptoms, using nutrition, physiotherapy and massage. She wants to avoid an operation at all costs. Theresia is bringing the subject to the political arena with her initiative "EndEndoSilence". Following the example set by France, she is demanding a national endometriosis strategy for Germany - and more research funding. After all, it's still not known what causes the disease.

Large companies around the world are presenting themselves as green and clean. Their promise: Where unavoidable emissions occur, they can be offset elsewhere. But do the environmental projects they point to really help the global climate?

The documentary looks at a forest reforestation project in the Honduran jungle and a project in Bangladesh that strives to bring solar-powered water disinfection to a village. Local people are often unaware that they are part of a climate effort, especially since these projects seldom result in any improvements to their lives. Nor do these projects demonstrate any significant global environmental benefit. Nevertheless, the carbon offsetting market is growing steadily, having quadrupled between 2020 and 2021 alone. It's no wonder that critics speak of 'greenwashing': mere marketing spin, that falsely purports to help the climate.

One outspoken critic of CO2 certificates is the Viennese climate scientist and model calculator Daniel Huppmann. Huppmann is looking for measurable answers in a system that thrives on opacity. And, it turns out, the level of CO2 in the atmosphere is higher than ever.

In August 2014, IS terrorists attacked the Yazidi community in northern Iraq. Thousands were killed. Women and girls were kidnapped and enslaved. An entire community was brutally hunted down. 10 years later, we look back on the genocide.

Hala and Faiza are two Yazidi women who experienced incredible cruelty. Hala was 16 years old when she was turned into a sex slave by the group known as Islamic State, or ISIS, in Iraq and Syria. After escaping from captivity, she struggled to regain her life in an overcrowded refugee camp in Iraq. Faiza, who was only 10 years old at the time, endured the trauma of enslavement with her mother and younger brothers. They were sold to several different slave owners. Eventually, they found an alienated form of coexistence with the perpetrators. When the opportunity for freedom presented itself, they fled to Canada. There, however, the children were confronted with a devastating new challenge: their mother's incurable illness. The film tells a story of suffering. But it is also a story of impressive human resilience. And it serves as a crucial reminder that, 10 years after the genocide, more than 2,700 Yazidi women and girls are still missing. Their fight for freedom continues.

People from all walks of life began to enthusiastically collect paintings. New genres were born. And both the art market and the profession of art dealer emerged. Exceptional artists such as Rembrandt van Rijn, Jan Vermeer and Frans Hals created masterpieces that still inspire us today.

One reason for the cultural heyday and its glut of paintings was an enormous surplus of capital, generated by speculative money transactions and trade, which was also based on the exploitation of the colonies and the ideal conditions that shipping found in the Netherlands.

The film traces a period in which art, too, became an economic factor. In a way, the 17th century can be seen as the origin of our current art system. After all, this was when auction houses were first established, leading to emergence of professional art dealers and wealthy collectors. Art was democratized.

This documentary film explores an era when business and art entered into a marriage for the first time. How did such an artistic flourishing come about? What art-historical innovations do we owe to this period? And what significance does it have for our view of art and our approach to art today?

Fresh fruit and vegetables at bargain prices. In Europe, this often goes hand in hand with exploitation and suffering. Most harvest laborers work and live in precarious conditions. The pickers deliver, but they also pay the price for our luxury.

The absurdity of consumer behavior in the western world is something we should've woken up to long ago. No matter the season, almost any type of fruit and vegetable can be purchased in the supermarket. But this takes a toll: both on our environment, as well as on the people who toil for our luxuries. Their suffering, however, is suppressed. The conditions under which they live and work do not seem to matter - the only thing that counts is picking speed. "You can't see the reality, it's hidden," says the chairman of the Andalusian agricultural workers' union.

Blueberries in Portugal, olives in Greece, strawberries in Spain - around one million migrants are currently working in European fields. The pickers are the itinerant laborers who fill the baskets of our supermarkets, most of them without receiving a contract or minimum wage, some without papers, or with high debts to intermediaries.

The film is a journey to the European fields where fruit and vegetables are grown. In southern Italy, Seydou from Mali picks oranges. He has no contract and is paid by the crate. He lives in a self-built hut in a settlement without water or electricity. The camera dives into the sea of cultivation tents that cover thousands of hectares of farmland and gives a face to people who are invisible in our society.

The search for World War Two's fallen soldiers is still ongoing. The German War Graves Commission receives more than 35,000 enquiries every year. Often, it's a chance find that puts researchers on the path to identifying a missing serviceman.

Edla C. never imagined receiving any more information about her brother. 10 years her senior, he was killed in battle in 1945 and became a legendary figure in the mind of his little sister. Now - at the age of 86 - she's holding the cast of a seal he was thought to be holding when he died. Suddenly, the only photograph she possesses of her brother comes alive; the few moments they shared in their lives become tangible.

These are moments that make the efforts of Oliver Breithaupt and Kathrin Krabs worthwhile. The two work for the German War Graves Commission. The commission still receives 35,000 enquiries every year from people seeking information about missing family members. Often, the search is triggered by a small, seemingly insignificant item: a photo, a letter, a death notice, a dog tag. Sometimes the find can be human remains unearthed by chance on building sites. Commission employees ensure that the remains are carefully and respectfully removed from their resting place.

Oliver Breithaupt and his team never know where the research is going to take them. It can often take years to identify the dead. Only once that is done can there be a name on a gravestone, so that the family has a place of remembrance.

Oliver Breithaupt's team takes care of war dead - regardless of which war they died in, regardless of their name or rank, regardless of any blame. By putting together the tiniest pieces of the puzzle, they try to give missing soldiers back their identities. And, by telling the stories of their fates, they hope to warn against future wars.

The Baltic states regained independence more than 30 years ago. Now, Russia has them looking over their shoulder, again. Moscow's invasion of Ukraine has left many people wondering whether Russia will set its power-hungry sights on the Baltic states, once more.

"There's only one enemy and that's Russia," says Estonian national Ain Tähiste, summing up his views on the issue in a sentence: "Latvia, Finland, Sweden - and on the Baltic Sea Poland, Germany, Denmark," he continues, "they're all friends, but not the Russian neighbor."

"It's naïve to think Russia's far away," he adds.

Ain Tähiste guides the reporter team through the military museum on Hiiumaa. The Estonian island in the west of the country was off-limits to tourists during Soviet rule, because its location on the Baltic Sea made it strategically important to Moscow. Since the start of the Russian war on Ukraine, Estonia has removed old Soviet monuments from public spaces and banished some of them to museums. "The Soviet Union occupied Estonia in 1940," Ain explains. "Are we still expected to pay our respects to the troops that occupied us? No, it was high time this happened!"

22-year-old Matthias Merelaine is from Tallinn and has no direct experience of the Soviet era. He's nevertheless preoccupied by the question of whether Russia will try to return to the Baltics. "We'd be ready," he says, "to go to the front, weapon in hand, to fight the enemy and defend the homeland."

National guards are booming in Baltic nations - including Lithuania. Paulus Jurkus, son of a fisher from Kleipėda, says he wouldn't run away, if attacked. The only port city in Lithuania, his home is not far from the border with the Russian enclave of Kaliningrad.

This new aversion to Russians is also omnipresent in Latvia. Lauris Aleksevejs is a top chef in Latvia's traditional seaside resort of Jurmala. The Russians used to be big spenders at Lauris' restaurant. And since Latvia closed its borders to Russians, his income has nosedived. But he refuses to do business with the enemy.

Rodolfo Dugarte Sanchez has a dream. The young teacher from the Venezuelan Andes wants the children of the remote village of Las Plumas to learn to read and write. He regularly walks almost four hours to teach them. Rodolfo had just started building a school when the pandemic hit. He's made no progress since. The crisis-ridden state of Venezuela is not supporting him. The provincial government in Mérida also seems indifferent to the children in the mountains.

Rodolfo was born and grew up in the remote Venezuelan Andean village of Los Nevados. Los Nevados is located in the Sierra Nevada National Park in the Venezuelan Andes. Here, the majestic Andes mountain range rises up, stretching across nearly the whole of South America.

Far from the political events and unrest in Venezuela's big cities, the inhabitants here live a simple life characterized by agriculture and livestock farming. There are almost no televisions here, let alone cell phone reception. Rodolfo was one of the few adolescents who was able to attend secondary school. He then studied hotel management in the provincial capital, before returning home.

When he found out that there was a village where the children had no schooling options, he made his way there. Since then, he has been fighting to build a school for the children, because he knows that education is the key to a better future.

Now, the pandemic is over and Rodolfo wants to resume his project. Will he succeed in building the children of Las Plumas a school?

Despite her disability, Mutlu relentlessly pursues justice for her sister, supported by her ever-loyal family: mother Hanim, elder sister Songul and brother Hakan.

Evoking the story of Mallalah, Mutlu turns to Tik-Tok and her 1.5 million followers for support. She articulates her anger by writing and recording a deeply personal protest song, and continuing to fight against femicide.

Gernot Grömer believes the first human to set foot on Mars has already been born. The astrophysicist thinks this journey should be possible within 20 to 30 years. His 'analog missions' are designed to simulate a stay on the red planet. Space travel is currently experiencing a new hype. Astrophysicist Gernot Grömer is the founder of the Austrian Space Forum (ÖWF), an association that aims to promote the topic of space travel in Austria.

The space enthusiasts are based in Innsbruck. They've been working on a spacesuit simulator there for 10 years. Gernot Grömer says: "It's by far the best tool that we can use to simulate the conditions under which people will one day live and work on Mars."

This year's mission is called AMADEE-24. It's being carried out by the ÖWF in cooperation with the Armenian AeroSpace Agency in the Ararat region - a place where the landscape is said to be a geological twin of the red planet. For one month, analog astronauts and a base team will simulate a stay on Mars.

However, the ÖWF doesn't just conduct research for Mars missions. Gernot Grömer is also leading work on a nano-satellite that searches for space debris. Space may be infinite, but the Earth's nearby orbits now resemble a large garbage dump. Last year, Elon Musk's latest satellite, Adler 2, was launched into space on a SpaceX rocket.

Rocket engineer Stefan Brieschenk, who wants to make Europe independent of SpaceX, founded the Rocket Factory Augsburg in 2018. He's working as fast as he can on a rocket that should soon be able to launch satellites into space from Europe, as cheaply as possible.

Rats are seen as transmitters of disease and are hated in the West. But to this day, we don't know very much about this feared animal. Science is only just beginning to properly delve into the world of rats and "rehabilitate" their image.

Worldwide, it's big cities that mainly have a big problem with rats. Few creatures are as present in society's general consciousness as the rat. They're immediately associated with chilling tales, and arouse emotions such as fear and disgust. Millions are spent every year in the battle to control them, while scientific approaches to sensible rat management are still in their infancy.

For a long time, the species has been conspicuously neglected by modern science. And apart from the interest that humans have shown in the rat as a laboratory animal, the level of ignorance in the science world is astonishing. Only now, in places as far-flung as Vancouver, Helsinki, Paris, New York and Berlin, are large-scale global research projects attempting to find answers to the fundamental questions concerning the human-rat relationship.

After all, ignorance surrounding our urban co-residents stokes fear. It fuels the "war" against rats that humans have been waging for centuries with all the means at their disposal - a battle that, again and again, turns out to be pointless and counter-productive.

Various research projects have already come up with some ideas about sustainable rat management methods. These would focus on nature and species protection, and recognize rats as part of the urban ecosystem.

The documentary "Urban Rats - Unknown Parallel Worlds" argues for a change in perspective. It poses the question of how humans can coexist in the future with their rodent neighbors, without harm or fear. The film takes a fresh look at what is an extremely controversial, emotionally charged issue.

Bhutan is famous as the 'land of happiness' in the Himalayas. But little is known about the country's subtropical South. This film explores the little-known region, where people live according to ancient traditions and maintain close-knit communities.

The landscape in Bhutan's South is characterized by dense jungle, unique biodiversity and mainly Hindu communities. In places that don't get many visitors, it's possible to get a sense of what life in the lowlands of Bhutan at the foot of the mighty mountain range is all about: community and togetherness.

Even though education and healthcare are free, there's no state welfare. Support is provided by society, instead. Far away from the urban centers, the documentary accompanies people who know how to help themselves in times of need. Like dentist Tenzin, who treats people in remote mountain villages free of charge. The documentary also shows the healing rituals of Bhutan's youngest shaman: 16-year-old Suresh feels he has been chosen to mediate between the living and the dead. He left school at the age 12 to pursue this calling.

In the heart of the jungle, shop owner Rinzin waits eagerly to be connected to the power grid and the Internet. The mother-to-be hopes this will not only make life easier for her, thanks to a fridge and rice cooker, but will also improve her children's education.

Many of Bhutan's traditions and customs are little-known. Many people here have a profound compassion: not only for their fellow human beings, but also for animals. Following an old Buddhist practice, the devout Sonam tries to save thousands of fish. Sonam is convinced that this is the only way he can preserve Bhutan's spiritual heritage and follow the path of Buddha.

Against all odds, Mutlu survives, but with life-changing injuries and a bullet in her head.

Still recovering, Mutlu cannot escape the reality of escalating attacks against Turkish women: her sister and caregiver Dilek is killed by her boyfriend, and a neighbor is murdered by her fiancé. Despite her disability, Mutlu relentlessly pursues justice for her sister, supported by her ever-loyal family: mother Hanim, elder sister Songul and brother Hakan.

Evoking the story of Mallalah, Mutlu turns to Tik-Tok and her 1.5 million followers for support. She articulates her anger by writing and recording a deeply personal protest song, and continuing to fight against femicide.

An HIV-positive diagnosis is something people still hide, today. In this film, people in Ireland living with HIV share their experiences - some for the first time on camera - with emotional candor, using a variety of means.

Robbie Lawlor was diagnosed with HIV at the age of 21 and was one of the youngest people to come out on Irish television. Enda McGrattan, aka Veda, promised to keep his HIV infection a secret for a decade, but finally came out by releasing a song. And a group of Irish women and migrants who cannot show their faces have nonetheless found creative ways to make their voices heard...

Based on a theater performance, the film was made by directing duo Anna Rodgers and Shaun Dunne. They used documentary film, performance and cross-genre storytelling techniques to make the protagonists' stories tangible. Using archive material and re-enactment, the queer Irish icon Thom McGinty, aka "The Diceman", who was one of the first in Ireland to speak openly about their AIDS illness, is also honored.

Exploring social stigma and the art of storytelling, this film highlights the experiences of people living with HIV in Ireland today.

Inside Zaporizhzhia - A Nuclear Power Plant in the Midst of War

With the Russian invasion of Ukraine, fears of a nuclear accident have returned. In the very first days of the war, Russian troops occupied the exclusion zone around what's left of Chernobyl. Shortly afterwards, they took control of Zaporizhzhia's nuclear power plant.

Russian troops withdrew from Chernobyl after a few weeks. But Zaporizhzhia, Europe's largest nuclear power plant, has effectively been occupied since March 2022. The plant has come under frequent attack, the power supply has been interrupted and fires have broken out. Experts have repeatedly warned of a possible nuclear disaster. How safe are nuclear power plants in a time of war? And how is the Russian occupation affecting the nuclear plant's Ukrainian employees? What can the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) do?

The documentary follows three employees of Ukrainian nuclear power plants and describes the consequences of the Russian occupation. These include fear, illegal interrogations and torture. For IAEA chief Rafael Grossi, staff working conditions are the biggest cause for concern.

Director Pavlo Cherepin's involvement in the film brought back personal memories. He learned the word evacuation early in his childhood, following the Chernobyl reactor accident. One of the worst nuclear disasters in history, Chernobyl has not been forgotten here in Ukraine -- a country that renounced nuclear weapons in 1994 in return for security guarantees.
